Worship and Music

In February we launched a worship service that included a new format with more emphasis on music with a contemporary feel that uses vocalists and instrumentalists, a PowerPoint projection of the hymns and updated versions of the liturgical elements that make up our traditional services including a call to worship, confession, readings, prayers, a sermon and communion. This kind of service, which may also include outside groups, dramatic skits and other new elements, is now planned for the last Sunday of each month. While the feedback we received was overwhelmingly positive, we want to answer for everyone a few questions that have been brought to our attention.

Why do we need a contemporary service?

This is really more of a “blended worship” that aims to join together CTS worshippers at one service to praise God in a way that appeals to the varied tastes of our diverse members. The desire to introduce this style of worship is related to the very nature of the church: it is good for worship to be blended because the body of Christ itself is blended. As we’re told in 1 Corinthians 12:12, “Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ.”

In that spirit, CTS brings together people from all walks of life, with different backgrounds, interests and abilities, who have in common their faith and love for God. Remember, all are welcome. It is our hope that this new service welcomes all to remain Christ-centered and faith-focused, uniting us in our common faith while including elements from both traditional and contemporary services that engage and inspire everyone. While we understand that this new type of service will still not appeal to each member, we are hopeful that the desire to remain unified in glorifying God will stay the number one priority, and we commit ourselves to ensuring that these services, like all of them, stay worship and praise-centered and not become entertainment-oriented, losing sight of why we gather together each Sunday.

Is this replacing any of our other services?

No. In addition to this blended service, we will have two traditional services (any of our ELW services or Now the Feast) and one folk service (Borning Cry, Chicago Folk, Gospel Train) a month.

Are we going to be able to hear some older hymns too?

Yes. We are working on compiling a “preferred hymn list” with suggestions given from CTS members and will work on incorporating some of those songs, from time to time, in our new service. We did this in February with “Holy, Holy, Holy,” a traditional hymn that was accompanied by guitar and drums to give it a more contemporary feel.

Why can we only see the words on the screen and not the music?

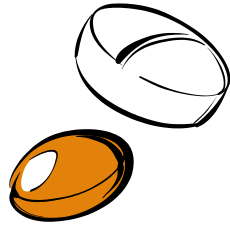

PRAYER DOTS

During Lent, when leaving the service, you will receive a small colored dot which we ask you to place on your watch, computer, cell phone or any other object that you frequently look at during the day. Then, every time you see the dot, we ask you to pause for a moment and say a prayer about the particular subject the dot represents, or anything else that comes to mind. The dots serve as a reminder to “pray without ceasing” as scripture tells us to do. The dot can also act as an evangelism tool if it is visible to others and they ask you what it represents. Each week, Pastor David will be preaching on the themes being discussed in the **40 Days of Love** small groups.

HEALING SERVICE—APRIL 3, 2011

On Sunday, April 3, both of our worship services will be focused on the ministry of healing through the Word, music, laying on of hands and with anointing oil.

The service of healing has been a form of Christian worship for hundreds of years. Historically, the laying on of hands and anointing with oil expresses the church’s intercession for those in need of healing in body, mind, and spirit, which indeed includes all of us.

There are several ways in which healing services in the church can be done. At Christ the Servant, we have chosen to do this during regular worship, rather than having a separate service. At both services on October 17, when you come forward for communion, you will receive it standing up and by intinction rather than kneeling at the communion rail. You may then either return to your seat or kneel at the rail for a blessing and anointing with oil.

We hope many of you will choose to participate in this ancient and meaningful ceremony and experience the healing power of God’s incredible love.

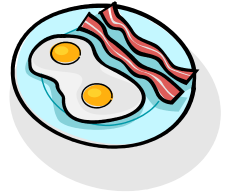

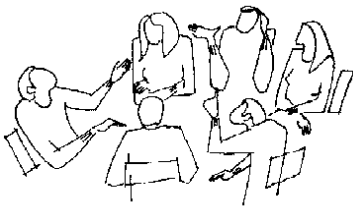
