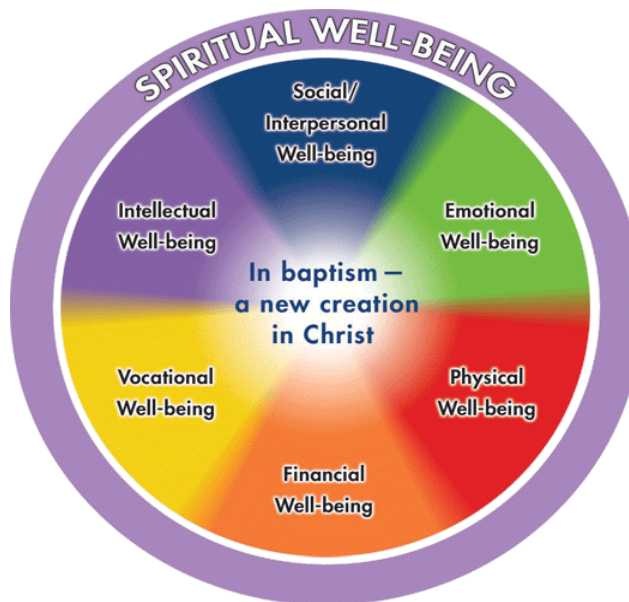

The following article is taken from *The Lutheran*, August 28 2011, p. 23.

#### **Six steps to sufficiency: How to be, have and do enough**

##### **1. Listen for the next right thing.**

We make thousands of tiny choices a day that make up a week, a year, a life. When making choices, tune into that invisible, intangible, yet consistent guidance that has run through your life thus far.

##### **2. Practice a beginner's mind.**

Become more playful in recognizing possibilities and outcomes.

##### **3. Live at the pace of the heart.**

Often our lives are forced to run at the speed of the mind, but the heart processes information much slower.

## A Message from our Pastor (con.)

### 4. Watch for what makes you speedy and therefore take on too much.

Often in our attempt to avoid feelings, such as grief or disappointment, we move too fast. Also watch for artificial emergencies. In this age of speed and efficiency, everything becomes urgent. But is it really?



### 5. Notice "dishonest" kindness.

When we extend ourselves beyond our present capacity, who does it serve? Ask yourself before promising to do something: Can I handle it? or Do I love it? Our lives have become more about what we can handle, instead of about what we love.

### 6. Create boundaries around your accessibility.

Avoid the 24/7 expectation of availability through email, social networks and cellphones. Do you want to be available by phone constantly, or could you occasionally turn it off? Establish email-free days.

## Paving the Way to Growth

French writer, Anatole France, once wrote, “To accomplish great things, we must not only act, but also dream; not only plan, but also believe.” Expanding our parking lot may not be considered a “great thing,” but our dreams of growth - of opening ourselves up to more visitors, of better accommodating our members and others who use our church on a weekly basis, of reaching out to those in our community who are looking for a place to be accepted and welcomed - certainly are. And we believe that this essential growth will be accomplished when we put into action our plan to add approximately 40-45 spaces to our parking lot later this fall.

Based on the congregation’s feedback Council received when we asked how you would like to see the matching parsonage sale funds used, expanding the parking lot became our top priority. Not only did it receive one of the highest number of overall votes, meaning it is extremely important to many of our members, we believe that CTS is positioned to be a welcoming haven to the un-churched in our “mission turf” and that a large, open and safe parking lot is the first impression we want to present to all who drive by. Additionally, the Mission Exploration Team process revealed to us that our congregation has a strong desire to help each other, and those around us, grow in our faith. Opening our doors to people we can serve and who can use their own talents and spiritual gifts to serve us and others, is a way to facilitate that growth. Learning Ministries also voiced concern about how busy and dangerous our parking lot has become as children and adults are heading into Sunday school and attending Roundabouts, Bible studies and other between-service events that encourage the spiritual growth of members of all ages. It is important that these members and visitors feel safe and comfortable as they arrive at our church, and they won’t even get to the door if they can’t get into a parking space!

Not only is this one of the most important of our projects, it is, unfortunately, one of the most expensive. But due to the expectation that construction costs will continue to rise and the fact that the work will need to get done before winter freezes the ground, we decided that it was important to move ahead so we can get the work done this year. After researching companies and receiving bids, we decided to contract with Poblocki, a well-known company that will be able to complete the project within days. The cost of the entire project is expected to be around \$38,500. Even with matching parsonage funds, which can’t exceed \$20,000, we are looking at a lofty fund-raising goal of \$19,250. That amounts to around \$450 per parking space.

***After the first three weeks of our seven week campaign, we have raised \$10,284.00. That’s a fantastic start! But we’ve just begun to “pave the way” and need your help.*** If you haven’t yet been able to make a special offering for our parking lot project, we ask you consider donating whatever amount is comfortable for you. If donating an entire space is possible, great! If not, whatever amount is reasonable for you to donate will go a long way to help us reach our goal. ***Our fundraising drive ends on Sunday, September 25,*** so we ask that any donations be made before that time. We plan on having our new parking lot finished in October!

We understand that many people are under financial constraints and we took that into prayerful consideration when deciding to go ahead with this project. But knowing that our congregation has embraced our mission to “welcome, worship, grow and serve” and that God blessed us with the successful sale of the parsonage so that we could use the resulting funds to help us fulfill that mission, we felt confident in approving this ambitious undertaking at this time. If you have any questions or concerns or would like more information, please contact any Council member or Pastor David. We are excited to share with you how our vision for CTS begins with the belief that “adding more parking spaces makes room for new faces.”

### MEMORIAL GARDEN



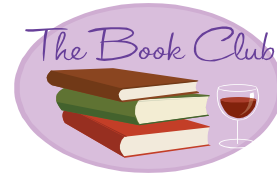

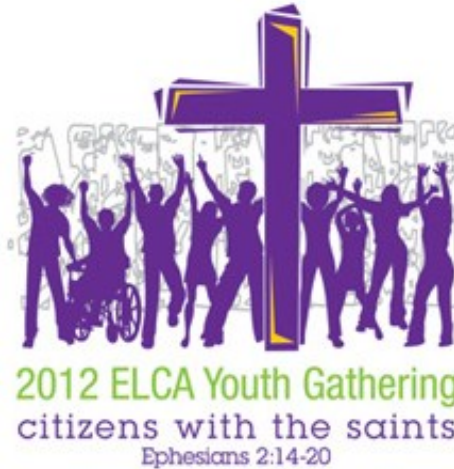
