## A Message from our Pastor

### Beginning the New Year with the Five Love Languages

Disciplining our children in love hasn't been easy. It's not the part of parenting I especially enjoy. We've tried all kinds of techniques. Super Nanny has some good ones! The "time out mat" works...for a while. The stern voice sometimes helps. Of course, there's the "positive reinforcement" thing they teach us in Psychology 101. But, kids seem to catch onto to that pretty quickly.

One of the greatest lessons Kristi and I have learned with our four children is that each child requires his or her own form of parenting. What works for one, doesn't necessarily work for the other. But the other lesson we have learned is that each child receives the message "I love you" in their own distinct way. If Kristi and I do not understand how each of our children best receives the message "I love you," then he or she may—at times—not feel loved.

The same holds true for Kristi and I. Before we discovered each other's "love language" there were more frequent times of disconnect. We wondered, perhaps, what the other one needed that we weren't providing. At times, we even felt as though we were being pulled "into a rut." I have plenty of examples to share with you. I'll wait until January!

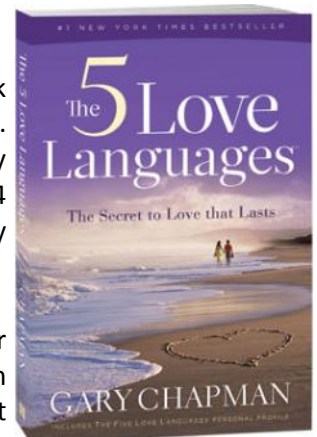
Then we were introduced to a concept that has wonderfully renewed how we see each other in our relationship, how we talk about our needs, and how we have assessed our own effectiveness in communicating the message "I love you" to each other. It's a concept that has refocused how we parent our children, and it has guided us in asking the question, "Are our children receiving the message that we love them?" It's a concept that has even guided me in ministry! So what's the concept? It's called the "Five Love Languages."

Beginning January 15, I am going to team up with Pastor Mark Myers in order to share this concept with you in worship. Pastor Myers is a local pastor and lead counselor at Trinity Christian Counseling located at 217 Wisconsin Ave. Suite 114 in Waukesha. The messages will be focused specifically around Dr. Gary Chapman's book, "The Five Love Languages."

I encourage you to seek an opportunity to purchase or borrow a copy of the book as we look to sharing this theme in worship. Open yourself up to this new and engaging concept of seeing yourself and others in our life (your spouse, your child, your parent, your friendships) as you grow in discovering even newer ways of connecting to those who mean so much to you in your life. Have fun with it! After all, learning about ourselves and learning about each other can be a lot of fun!

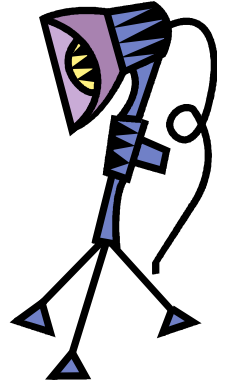
## Helping the Poor and Needy in Waukesha

With a generous gift from a family of CTS, a special fund was put in place to help those who have run out of options to support themselves and their families. The Helping Hands fund regularly works with the Hope Center which screens requests for assistance.

During the past year we were able to help:

- 21 individuals and families with rent assistance
- 3 individuals with security deposits to get shelter and get off the street
- 3 individuals with emergency dental bills
- 2 families with utility bills
- Provided many gas and bus tickets to allow transportation to work
- Provided a pair of work boots for a man who needed them to get a job
- Helped a woman pay for needed high blood pressure medication
- Provided for a woman to purchase coats and boots for her 2 homeless children and a coat for herself.
- Provided a two night stay at Super 8 for a homeless woman the day after surgery
- Provided a one night stay at Super 8 for a 70 year old man waiting for his apartment to be ready the next day
- Helped several individuals with medical co pay fees
- Made available Pick & Save gift cards for emergency situations

This is a partial list of how our Helping Hands Fund is helping the Hope Center underwrite some of the many requests they continue to receive every day.



## The Council's Corner

Thanks to everyone who was able to make it to the special congregational meeting on December 4th. We unanimously accepted the proposed changes to our constitution which will allow us to conform the requirements of the ELCA and updates our current practices and committee functions at CTS. The next step is to ratify it, without changes, at our annual meeting which will require a 2/3 majority vote. Once it is ratified by our members, we will send it to the synod for final approval. While the synod has up to 120 days to give its approval, we've been assured of a fairly quick turnaround, which means the new constitution should go into effect sometime in February.

Thank you again to everyone who took the time to read through the constitution, provided input and voted on December 4th. Your support in this effort is invaluable.

## Social Ministry

### Volunteer Opportunity!!

Are you looking to volunteer in a way that will help CTS reach out to our surrounding community? I would like to bring a ministry called Touched Twice United to our church. The primary purpose of this ministry is to meet human needs in Christ's name. This is done by hosting free clinics which strive to meet the medical, physical and spiritual needs of the guests—all on a budget of zero dollars and zero cents.

With the hardships that many of our neighbors have faced in recent times there is no doubt a great need exists in our community for a ministry that helps with medical, physical and spiritual needs. A clinic is typically a one day event, held on a Saturday morning. The event can be big or small depending on the resources available. Volunteers can range from doctors, dentists and chiropractors, to photographers, hair stylists, musicians and mechanics. How we choose to organize the clinic is completely up to us - the options are endless.

If you go to [www.touchedtwiceunited.org](http://www.touchedtwiceunited.org) you can learn a lot more about this exciting ministry. They have made all the resources available to us, needed for a successful event, at no cost. As you can imagine, it takes a lot of prayer and planning to create an organized event of this nature. Above all, this event would require a large number of volunteers. I am putting this call out to see if we have enough interest within the congregation to create a large enough pool of volunteers for a Touched Twice United Clinic here at CTS. **Touched Twice** – This program guides us to create a clinic supported by volunteers to reach those in needs by assisting them in healthcare, spiritual care and other basic services such as hair stylists and mechanics.

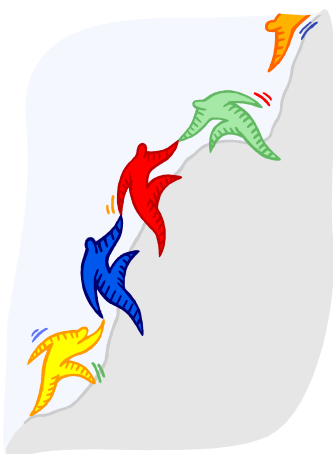
**Hope Center** – Serve a hot meal, donate food or supplies to this organization that cares for the poor and homeless right here in Waukesha.
