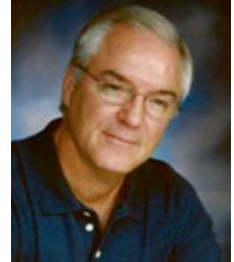

### **Quiet Time in God's Presence**

Words on wellness from Pastor Kevin Ruffcorn

November 2011 — As God's unofficial onsite representative, I've spent most of my life in a (more or less) one-sided conversation, advising God on what needed to be done. My prayer time was filled with prayer requests—mostly for me, but also for others. I'd spell out the situation to the Lord and then "subtly" suggest possible solutions. I thought, like many Christians, that as long as I'm in the thick of things, I knew best what should happen. Though my prayer life was relatively robust, it was frustrating and did little to provide me peace and/or strength. I was never very good at centering prayer. I never could sit still for more than a few minutes, and the voices in my mind didn't respond well to "Shut Up!"

My prayer life started to change while studying for my doctorate, and continued to change during my Journey of Renewal. What I found most helpful to my spiritual life and walk with the Lord is a modified centering prayer. Centering prayer is often thought to be similar to meditation. A person sits quietly, seeking to still the cacophony of one's thoughts, enjoying being in God's presence, and listening for God's whisper.

I'm an early morning riser, so finding a quiet place is not a problem for me. After grabbing the necessary cup of coffee, I sit back and read the thought for the day from a devotional booklet such as Christ in Our Home or The Word in Season. I spend a few minutes reflecting on the message of the devotional. My reading and reflection usually stills my spirit and allows me to begin to sit quietly in God's presence (not still and silent, but quiet). Often I use a brief "mantra" like "My rock and my fortress, my God in whom I trust" to focus my thoughts.

I sit enjoying my coffee, a flickering candle and the sounds of a still sleeping house. Instead of banishing all thoughts, I use the thoughts that float to the surface of my consciousness as prayer reminders—Bob's surgery, the kids in my confirmation class, family members, or world events. Rather than seek to give advice, I simply raise them before the Lord and visualize placing them in his hands.

I don't have a time limit, and I try not to chide myself for not spending as much time in prayer as I should. When I'm refreshed and filled, I thank God for the special time we've spent together and then begin to physically prepare for the day ahead. Giving up my advisory role and spending quiet time in God's presence gives me peace, a fresh perspective on life, and an inner strength to meet the challenges of the day.

## Senior Independence

All types of dementia are progressive, including Alzheimer's. However, research has shown that involvement in specific types of activities, including socialization, will slow the progression.

LSS MindWorks, a bi-weekly program that helps clients learn methods to strengthen memory, is making strides to help people with dementia. MindWorks is a memory enhancement program based on current research and other successful programs. The MindWorks model helps the individual with early memory loss utilize the capabilities that they possess, while providing the caregiver with respite. Through MindWorks, participants engage in brain fitness activities and light physical exercise designed to support their cognitive function and their ability to live as independently as possible. Because participants meet twice each week, a natural network of peer support forms. The structured group setting creates a non-threatening environment for participants to learn and share. Participants gain a renewed sense of purpose and hope that contributes positively to their well-being and self-esteem. At the same time, caregivers benefit from the respite time provided by their loved ones' involvement in MindWorks.

Early detection is important. Know the 10 warning signs of Alzheimer's<sup>1</sup>:

- Memory changes that disrupt daily life
- Challenges in planning or solving problems
- Difficulty completing familiar tasks at home, at work or at leisure
- Confusion with time or place
- Trouble understanding visual images and spatial relationships
- New problems with words in speaking or writing
- Misplacing things and losing the ability to retrace steps
- Decreased or poor judgment
- Withdrawal from work or social activities
- Changes in mood and personality

LSS provides housing and aging services to over 5,000 older adults and persons with disabilities. Our programs promote and encourage client independence; offer opportunities for our clients to engage in meaningful activities; provide a wonderful opportunity to socialize and develop relationships; and allow caregivers to receive much needed respite while their loved ones can still remain living at home.
